Toddler Activities

Use an old box, puncture random holes all over, and tie different textured and length string, yarn, pipe cleaners, ect.- Allie (Thistle Room)

Color sorting with pom poms and a cardboard tube, tape tube to wall and encourage children to put pom poms through. Name colors, and talk to your child.- Allie (Thistle Room)

Pre-K Activities by Pat (Olive Room)

Science Project: Spinning Eggs

Materials: Get 1 hard-boiled egg and 1 raw egg

- 1) Spin both eggs carefully
- 2) After the eggs spins determine which one is hard-boiled and raw

Conclusion: The difference of the raw and hard-boiled egg is that the raw egg shift around while it spins around and hard-boiled (cook) egg should spin faster than the raw egg because of the gravity in the solid center.

Rainbow walk or bike, scooter, etc. outside of your neighborhood

The color of the rainbows is **red, orange, yellow, green, blue, purple.**

How many color do you see? Example: I see 1 red, 2 orange, and so on.

When the child get back from their walk draw a map of their walk or route.

Pre-K Activities by Pat (Olive Room) Cont.

Math:

Find things around the house such as cheerios, buttons, coins, rocks, pencils, crayons, straws, and so on.

Group the items together in 10.

Example: Group of 10 cheerios. How many group of 10 cheerios will make 100 cheerios. You can also find things in your backyard as bringing nature into math.

Cooking:

Carrot salad (Easter)

It can be pre-shredded or cut into shredded of carrots. Mix with raisins, mayonnaise (little) or as needed while tasting and mix it all together. It is optional to add pineapples.

School Age Activities

Marble Maze made with paper towel and toilet paper rolls.

We have done activities in school age similar to this and the children seemed to really enjoy it. It's a great STEM activity. You can also use paper plates to be even more creative with this activity.
